

#### The Mass – The Liturgy of the Word Cycle of Readings for the Seasons: The Easter Season

After Divine Mercy Sunday, there are a further five Sundays in the Easter Season – therefore, seven in all if counted from Easter Sunday. The feast of the Ascension is celebrated in Ireland on the seventh Sunday of Easter, and the following Sunday is Pentecost, which concludes the season of Easter. The Sunday readings for the Easter season follow a three year cycle. The gospel readings are chosen to reflect a particular thematic cycle, although the Gospel of Saint John is used more frequently on the Sundays of Easter since it is written from a particularly conscious Easter perspective. These Gospels are arranged thematically. The first readings in the Easter season are taken from the Acts of the Apostles, since this document recounts the first years of the life of the Church, from the experience of the risen Christ to Pentecost to the missionary expansion of the Church. The second readings are chosen to reflect Easter themes in the epistles, particularly the nature and consequences of baptism.

Therefore, in Year A, the following is the thematic arrangement for the gospel readings: Sunday 2 [Divine Mercy Sunday]: The first apparition of the risen Christ on Easter Sunday afternoon in the Upper Room [John 20:19-31]; Sunday 3: the journey to Emmaus [Luke 24:13-35]; Sunday 4: Jesus, the gate of the sheepfold (the only way to salvation) [John 10:1-10]; Sunday 5: Jesus, the way, the truth and the life [John 1:1-12]; revealing the Ascension and the promise of the Advocate [John 14:15-21]. In Year B, the following is the thematic arrangement of the gospel readings: Divine Mercy Sunday: the apparition of the Risen Christ in the Upper Room [John 20:19-31]; Sunday 3: St. Luke's account of the appearance of the Risen Christ in the Upper Room, emphasising that the apostles are chosen witnesses to his death and resurrection [Luke 24:35-48]; Sunday 4: Christ the Good Shepherd [John 10:11-18]; Sunday 5: Christ the Vine [John 15:1-8]; Sunday 6: the disciple participates in Christ's relationship with the Father – the commandment of love [John 15:9-17]. In Year C, the thematic arrangement is as follows: Divine Mercy Sunday: the appearance of the Risen Christ in the Upper Room [John 20:19-31]; Sunday 3: the appearance of the Risen Christ by the Sea of Galilee [John 21:1-19]; Sunday 4: Christ who protects his sheep [John 10:27-30]; Sunday 5: the New Commandment – "love one another as I have loved you" [John 13:31-35]; Sunday 6: preparation for the Ascension and the promise of the Holy Spirit, who will live within the disciple [John 14:23-29].
