

Sunday 1st November, 2020
*Feast of All Saints***

November, known traditionally as the Month of the Holy Souls, begins with the two great feast days, All Saints (1st November) and All Souls (2nd November). These feast days are intimately related. On All Saints Day we remember the simple reassurance that there are souls that have lived according to the Gospel in great fidelity. They have lived the commandments as Our Lord teaches us. They have lived according to the Holy Spirit who is in us from the day of our baptism. Life in the Spirit is a life that actively desires the holiness that belongs to God, to be filled with His grace, to put aside sin, to know the mercy of God and to show it forth. Although we might look at our own Christian lives and wonder if we can attain to this kind of life, we know it is the good and beautiful life that Jesus wants for us. We also know that we have known many souls whose interior life and whose actions in thought, word and deed have manifested a deep union with God. Their love of Jesus is evident. The life of the Spirit in them bears fruit. These are the saints who have merited, through the mercy of God, to be joined with Him in heaven. We celebrate them, countless and unnamed, on All Saints Day.

All Souls Day reminds us perhaps more readily of the state of our own souls, how we do not manifest the holiness of God as we would like to, that His Spirit has not entered into every corner of our being to make it like himself. Am I fit to stand in the presence of Him who is Holy, Holy, Holy? It is this awareness, and the Christian relationship between hope and humility – the hope of Heaven and union with God, the humility of looking at our lives in the light of truth - that leads us to pray for the dead, since we know that God does not give up His desire to purify our will and lead us to himself. The work of conversion uncomplete here below continues beyond, in that place we call Purgatory. The souls there are purified by hope and love, of all that does not belong to God. They are filled instead with a longing for union with God and that alone. It is this longing for union with God that unites us all, both in Heaven and on earth. It is for this reason that we pray for the dead: that they might enjoy union with God in holiness. It is the desire for union with God that marks the solidarity of all the baptised, those who are on their pilgrimage here below, those who are completing their pilgrimage in Purgatory, those who have reached their home in Heaven with God.

**Please note the following for attending Mass on Sundays
WHEN the Government Restrictions are lifted**

- Because of the limited number of places, it is necessary to signal your Sunday Mass preference to the parish office. **There is limited availability for the following Sunday Masses: Saturday 6 pm; Saturday 7.30 pm, Sunday 11 am and Sunday 6 pm**
- **It is not necessary to have a seat allocated for weekday Mass.** Please leave **10 am Mass** to the elderly and those with underlying conditions.
- **Please LEAVE Friday evening Mass** to the families of the deceased.
- **Please LEAVE Month's Mind Masses** to the family of the deceased.
- Please follow this simple principle when taking a seat: **TWO PEOPLE PER PEW, OR ONE HOUSEHOLD.**
- Please observe the two metre rule when entering the Cathedral, going for Holy Communion or exiting the Cathedral, and at all times both inside and in the grounds of the Cathedral.
- Please **wear a mask in the Cathedral** unless a medical condition prevents you from doing so. This is for your own protection and out of consideration for those in the Cathedral with you.
- **Please sanitise your hands upon entrance and exit.**
- Please **do not** congregate at the doors or in the Cathedral grounds.
- **Sacristy Access:** To minimise risk to our Sacristy and Volunteers, **it will not be possible to allow general access to the Sacristy** for the time being.
- Please **arrange Masses** through the Parish Office and arrange to meet with a Priest at the Parochial House - 9121021. (Mass offerings can be dropped into the Parochial House post box.)
- **Signed Mass Cards** are available from the Parish Office, **please request by phone** and cards will be ready for collection.



Please do not attend the Cathedral if you have a high temperature, cough, sneezing or any signs of Covid-19.

LEVEL 5 RESTRICTIONS
