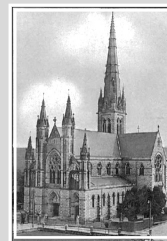

First Sunday of Lent

THE MASS – THE ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

Although the Entrance Antiphon is generally read by the priest once he reaches the chair, the antiphon is intended to be sung, either on its own or accompanied by a psalm verse. The entrance antiphon is a verse taken from sacred scripture, and it sets out a particular mystery of faith that is reflected in the other texts of the Mass for Sundays and Feast Days. Have you noticed: the Sunday prayers are used throughout the following week, except on Feast Days, which have their own proper texts? The texts used in the Mass – frequently set to music – are taken largely from the Scriptures, so that the Mass is an ongoing reflection by the Church on the word of God. We can say that the Church speaks to God using the words with which God has spoken to us.

While the Mass is always an intensely personal prayer for all of us, we must always recall that it is, first and foremost, the prayer of the whole Church, throughout the world, in all its different circumstances, and in all the circumstances of history. The Entrance Antiphon, in particular, captures a vast array of human experience, from the movement of the soul to the circumstance of life and history, and it directs us to raise those sentiments, movements and experiences to God and to His grace. This Sunday, the antiphon is taken from Psalm 90 and relates directly to the Gospel, where we hear Satan quoting the Psalm as he tempts Jesus to test the Father's love by throwing himself from the pinnacle of the Temple in Jerusalem (where God's presence was found in the Holy of Holies), to see whether the Father would indeed rescue him. It would be the same test that Jesus would be taunted with on the cross: "The people stood watching, and the rulers even sneered at him. They said, 'He saved others; let him save himself if he is God's Messiah, the Chosen One'" (Luke 23:35). But the psalm in question was a great psalm of God's comfort for his oppressed people, for his chosen one, Israel, and ultimately for Jesus, the Eternal Son our Saviour: "His love he set on me, so I will rescue him; protect him for he knows my name. When he calls, I shall answer, I am with you, I will save in distress and give him glory. Jesus would call out in despair on the cross, "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me". The Father's response is the glory of the resurrection, when sin and death are vanquished by Jesus' searing experience of sacrifice and suffering.

There will be a **Vigil of Prayer for Peace in the Ukraine** beginning **Friday 11th March** after 10 am Mass, concluding on **Saturday 12th March** with 10 am Mass. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed. You are encouraged to make an hour of prayer with the Lord for our suffering brothers and sisters, and to beg God to move hearts, to convert the oppressor and to keep this conflict from spreading beyond its current extent.

MARCH RETREATS IN THE DIVINE MERCY CENTRE

Saturday 12th March from 2 pm – 5.30 pm: **‘True conversion - Jonah the Prophet’**. Lent is a time to turn back to God. It's a special time in the year to seek to deepen our relationship with Him. Friday 25th until Sunday 27th March: Retreat about the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Lent is a special time of turning back to the Lord, of repentance and conversion. It's a time when we seek to be reconciled to God. The primary place for this is the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession). It's a place where we can experience God's Mercy and forgiveness. That's our first focus of this retreat - to see Confession as a wonderful gift of the Father of Mercies. We will learn more about the sacrament, how to prepare for it well, how to make a good Confession.
