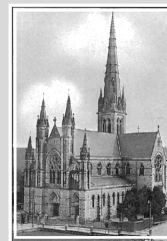

*Fourth Sunday of Easter*

### **THE MASS – CANDLES: TABERNACLE LAMP & ALTAR CANDLES**

The relationship of every other candle in the church to the Paschal Candle is made clear during the Easter Vigil, when the altar candles are lit, at the Gloria, from the Paschal Candle. No doubt the use of candles and lamps had a practical function from the beginning – so that the priest might read the text of the Mass. But they also reflect the use of candles and lamps in the Old Testament. The lamp of the presence shone in the Temple of Jerusalem, signifying the Lord's presence in the Holy of Holies. Little wonder that this one lamp is replicated in every place where the Blessed Sacrament is reposed, signifying the Lord's true presence in our midst, within the Tabernacle.

In the Cathedral, the tabernacle lamp is of particular magnificence. Made of solid silver, it is adorned with doves [evoking Colm Cille – the dove of the Church – as well as the Holy Spirit who descended as tongues of fire upon the Church at Pentecost], angels [evoking the cherubim and seraphim who adore the Lord on high], and the papal crown or *triregnum* [a gesture of fidelity and communion with the Apostolic See]. The lamp itself is held in a 'nest' of three pelicans, an ancient Eucharistic symbol; it was thought that the pelican would perforate its breast to feed its young. This was taken as an allusion to Christ, who opens his side to flow with water and blood – revealing Baptism and the Eucharist. These indicate clearly to the Lamp's purpose: to point to the Lord's Eucharistic Presence.

Candles then adorn the altar and must be lit for each Mass, as they are for each formal liturgy. The number of candles can vary according to the solemnity of the celebration. For the most solemn celebrations, even the side altars can be adorned with lighted candles. The faithful then light candles and lamps before the images of Our Lord and of the saints, as a tangible expression of their prayer, and a living presence before the Lord when they have departed the church to go about their affairs. For the same reason, it is a beloved custom to light blessed candles at home as an expression of our prayer to God. These are blessed particularly on the Feast of the Presentation

of the Lord, or Candlemas, when we recall Simeon's words as he took the child Jesus in his arms to present him as an offering to the Father: "At last, all powerful Master, you give leave to your servant to go in peace, according to your promise. For my eyes have seen your salvation which you have prepared for all nations, a light to enlighten the gentiles and give glory to Israel, your people" (Luke 2:29-32).

To mark the month of May and the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima, there will be a **THREE EVENING REFLECTION ON OUR LADY**, at the Divine Mercy Centre on Wednesday 11th, Thursday 12th and Friday 13th May at 8 pm.
