

Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

THE MASS – THE PENITENTIAL RITE

After the liturgical greeting [The Lord be with you...], the celebrant invites the people to prepare for the celebration of Mass with these or similar words: "Brothers and sisters, that we might worthily offer these sacred mysteries, let us call to mind our sins".

With these words, the penitential rite of the Mass begins. It is clear that both priest and people enter into this moment together, each placing themselves before God as equally in need of mercy and acknowledgement of their unworthiness and weakness as they undertake to participate in the holy sacrifice of the Mass. It is profoundly significant that this is the first moment of the Mass, for it reminds us that we come as a community of sinners who have been redeemed and who seek to enter more fully into the mystery of salvation. Who can offer the perfect and pure act of worship but Jesus himself, the eternal Son of the Father, who, as we have seen, manifests on the cross his unending self-giving to the Father, namely the sacrifice of love that is our salvation.

Each of us, the redeemed, acknowledge that our relationship with God is never one of equals, even as we are brought to realise that God in Christ has made us like himself and continuously pours the gift of His Spirit into our hearts. There is, therefore, a powerful dynamic between sinner and redeemed in each soul, whereby we come to the Mass as sons and daughters because we have first been redeemed by Christ's sacrifice on the cross and his blessed resurrection.

At the very beginning of the Mass, therefore, we are brought before the mystery of God's mercy, and in each Mass we renew our awareness of its transforming power: by His mercy we have been redeemed, and by His mercy we are called to acknowledge our sins and to accept the grace that flows in abundance from the heart of Christ. The invitation to acknowledge our sins is an invitation into the whole mystery that is communicated in the Mass, the mystery of Divine Mercy. We become aware of what burdens our souls and conscience, we acknowledge that our heart is divided and always caught up in the dynamic of good and evil, of the spirits that lead us away from the Father's will and the Spirit by which Jesus perfectly fulfils the Father's will. It is here, at the foot of the altar, so to speak, that we stand in union with the tax collector, standing a

long way off and beating our breast and saying, God, have mercy on me, a sinner" (cf. Luke 18:13). We seek to leave our offering before the altar and to be reconciled with our brother and sister before making the offering (cf. Matthew 5:24). We are invited into a moment of honesty and humility before our conscience, knowing that no one can look upon the face of God and live (cf. Exodus 33:20). And yet, it is precisely the face of God that we are invited to behold in Jesus, in his word and in his Sacrament, to look at him with uncovered faces and to reflect His glory (2 Corinthians 3:18). In short, we are entering upon a great mystery and it befits us to enter by the narrow door of humility and to trust in His great mercy.
