The human person is very resilient. Already the experience of pandemic, despite its enduring effects for many, has receded into the background; life goes on. In these days we are marking the 25th anniversary of the Good Friday Agreement, which, despite the wounds that all kinds of injustice and violence will always create, nevertheless has allowed new generations to live in peace.

Easter Sunday

Peace, we have heard it said in these days, is not the absence of war but the presence of justice. This striking phrase allows us to reflect on the nature of justice. Ultimately, the Christian understands that justice is the gift of God. When we realise that the cross is God's judgement over the world, we begin to see that justice comes from His mercy; God alone can do true justice to the nations, and to souls. It calls upon forgiveness and reconciliation. It is the work of the cross, a labour of suffering and love on our behalf. It brings the peace that is the gift of the resurrection, whereby Christ has overcome sin and death. It is a free gift to those who believe, since "he came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near; for through him both of us have access in one Spirit to the Father" [Ephesians 2:17].

This peace is the gift of the resurrection. While it is first of all a gift to the soul, it is also one that infiltrates every aspect of our living, how we live together, and how we build our communities. It is a challenging work. The weakness of sin makes the human enterprise of justice fragile and imperfect, leading to fear and distrust. But for those who believe in Christ and in his victory over sin and death, we become witnesses to hope, knowing that in Jesus the Lord there is indeed true justice and peace. For "God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us - even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ - by grace you have been saved - and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, so that in the ages to come he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus" [Ephesians 2:4-7]. A blessed Easter to one and all.

May the Risen Christ fill your hearts with joy, bring you new hope and bless you with His peace. Amen.

DIVINE MERCY NOVENA



In the Diary of St. Faustina, Jesus asked that the Feast of Divine Mercy, known today as Divine Mercy Sunday, be preceded by a Novena to the Divine Mercy. We pray the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy each day for a specific intention. Our Lord told St. Faustina, "I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that they may draw . . . strength and refreshment and whatever grace they need in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death" (Diary, 1209).

Third Day: Today bring to Me ALL DEVOUT AND FAITHFUL SOULS, and immerse them in the ocean of My mercy. The souls brought Me consolation on the Way of the Cross. They were that drop of consolation in the midst of an ocean of bitterness.

Fourth Day: Today bring to Me The PAGANS AND THOSE WHO DO NOT YET KNOW ME. I was thinking also of them during My bitter Passion, and their future zeal comforted My Heart. Immerse them in the ocean of My mercy.

Fifth Day: Today bring to Me THE SOULS OF THOSE WHO HAVE SEPARATED THEMSELVES FROM MY CHURCH, and immerse them in the ocean of My mercy. During My bitter Passion they tore at My Body and Heart, that is, My Church. As they return to unity with the Church, My wounds heal and in this way they alleviate My Passion.

Sixth Day: Today bring to Me THE MEEK AND HUMBLE SOULS AND THE SOULS OF LITTLE CHILDREN, and immerse them in My mercy. These souls most closely resemble My Heart. They strengthened Me during My bitter agony. I saw them as earthly Angels, who will keep vigil at My altars. I pour out upon them whole torrents of grace. Only the humble soul is capable of receiving My grace. I favour humble souls with My confidence.

Seventh Day: Today bring to Me THE SOULS WHO ESPECIALLY VENERATE AND GLORIFY MY MERCY, and immerse them in My mercy. These souls sorrowed most over my Passion and entered most deeply into My spirit. They are living images of My Compassionate Heart. These souls will shine with a special brightness in the next life. Not one of them will go into the fire of hell. I shall particularly defend each one of them at the hour of death.

Eighth Day: Today bring to Me THE SOULS WHO ARE DETAINED IN PURGATORY, and immerse them in the abyss of My mercy. Let the torrents of My Blood cool down their scorching flames. All these souls are greatly loved by Me. They are making retribution to My justice. It is in your power to bring them relief. Draw all the indulgences from the treasury of My Church and offer them on their behalf. Oh, if you only knew the torments they suffer, you would continually offer for them the alms of the spirit and pay off their debt to My justice.

Ninth Day: Today bring to Me SOULS WHO HAVE BECOME LUKEWARM, and immerse them in the abyss of My mercy. These souls wound My Heart most painfully. My soul suffered the most dreadful loathing in the Garden of Olives because of lukewarm souls. They were the reason I cried out: 'Father, take this cup away from Me, if it be Your will.' For them, the last hope of salvation is to run to My mercy.
