

#### THE MASS - ALLELUIA!

As Pope Saint John Paul [II] once said, "We are an Easter people, and alleluia is our song" [Apostolic Visit to Oceania, 1986]. We are all aware that Alleluia is the great acclamation of the Easter Season. This year we were delighted and amazed by the choir's rendition of Handel's Alleluia Chorus, and we become aware of the frequent use of the acclamation throughout the Easter Season.

At the Vigil, it is the custom for the deacon to proclaim the Alleluia to the Bishop, in that way announcing, as it were, the Resurrection. This is followed by the joyous 'Alleluia Psalm' [Psalm 118]. The exuberance of our singing of the Alleluia at the Easter Vigil and on Easter Day follows the great fast of the Lenten Season, when the Church sets aside her songs of joy and is clothed in garments of penance.

The word is an ancient acclamation of praise of God. It is a Hebrew word, composed of two parts [Allelu – Ia], that have the meaning, "Praise the Lord", or even "Praise Him Who Is". They pick up on the revelation of the Holy Name to Moses: "I am Who Am". Consequently, it manifests faith in the One God "who is and was and is to come" [Revelations 1:8] and is amongst the most ancient affirmations of monotheism. Already in the Old Testament it is clear that it was used within public prayer, since it forms part of a number of Psalms, particular the last two Psalms, nos. 149 [Alleluia, Praise the Lord from the heavens, praise Him in the heights...], and 150 [Alleluia, Praise God in His Holy Place...]. Thus, it was within the worship of the Temple [in Jerusalem], Alleluia was used as an acclamation both of praise and of acknowledgement of the One God.

It is unsurprising that Alleluia should become part of the worship of the first Christian communities, brought by the apostles and first disciples from the Temple to the prayers of the Christian community and hence the Mass. At each Mass, with the exception of Lent, it introduces the Gospel, almost as if we are being reminded that here God is speaking. As an acclamation of joy and faith, it is added to antiphons throughout the Easter season, and frequently throughout the year. It is used in the Liturgy of the Hours [e.g., Morning Prayer] and in other liturgical contexts. And during the Easter Season, the

Mass and the Liturgy of the Hours concluded with a double Alleluia [Go in the peace of Christ, Alleluia, Alleluia!]. It is used in sacred songs and hymns, and is itself a refrain for the Psalms. Since it acknowledges the oneness of God and His victory over sin and death in the resurrection, its fittingness for the Easter proclamation becomes clear: Jesus Christ is the Eternal Son of the Father who has conquered sin and death for us and our salvation: Alleluia, alleluia!
