THE MASS – THE COLLECT [OPENING PRAYER]

The Collect, or Opening Prayer, concludes with a Trinitarian formula: through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever; to which the people respond: Amen. Most of the Collects are addressed directly to the Father. We pray through the mediation of the Son, who is the Saviour and Redeemer. This takes place through the power of the Holy Spirit, for all prayer is by the agency of the Spirit, who is in us since we received him from Christ.

This model of prayer is taught to us by Jesus himself, who taught us to pray by addressing ourselves to God as "our Father". In doing so, we are invited into the relationship of Jesus with the Father, a relationship that manifests the true nature of God. We enter into this relationship by virtue of baptism, by which the Holy Spirit makes his home within us and becomes the living agent of our relationship with God. The Spirit is sent to us from the Father through and from the Son and is within us the living principle of filiation or sonship: we are 'sons in the Son', sons and daughters of the Father because of the mystery of our baptism, by which we are saved, redeemed and adopted into the Son's relationship with the Father.

The Trinitarian formula at the conclusion of the Collect – and of many prayers – also reminds us of the equality of the Father, the Son and the Spirit. The Son "lives and reigns" with the Father. This is "in the unity" of the Holy Spirit. The Lord's ascension teaches us that he is co-equal with the Father. The Spirit is revealed as the very unity with God Himself, and the source not only of our life but of holiness and goodness itself. "Who is good but God alone?", Jesus asks the rich young man rhetorically. The Spirit is holiness and goodness itself. He is God, the Father's gift to those who acknowledge Jesus as Son, Redeemer and Saviour. Finally, the Trinitarian formula at the conclusion of the Collect underlines once again the divinity of the Son: he is "God, for ever and ever". Rightly do we respond: "Amen". The **HOLY ROSARY** will be prayed at **Our Lady's** Altar from Tuesday to Friday after the 7 pm Mass and on a Monday at 7 pm during the Month of May. Everyone is very welcome to join in.

The **LEGION OF MARY** will recite the Holy Rosary for the Month of May at the **entrance to the Long Lane** on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 7 pm. Everyone is very welcome.
