

THE MASS – THE LITURGY OF THE WORD Cycle of Readings for the Seasons: The Easter Triduum – Good Friday

The readings for Good Friday are also invariable from year to year. The first reading is the powerful reading from chapters 52 and 53 of the Prophet Isaiah [52:13-53:12], reflecting on the figure of the "suffering servant", all of which is a striking evocation of the suffering of Jesus and its redemptive purpose: "see my servant will prosper, he shall be lifted up, exalted, rise to great heights. As the crowds were appalled at seeing him - so disfigured did he look that he seemed no longer human – so will the crowds be astonished at him, kings stand speechless before him...". Pslam 30 compliments the meditation: "Into your hands I commend my Spirit", the words spoken by Jesus as he gives his life on the cross; "My life is in your hands, deliver me" reflecting the cry of Jesus, "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?". The Passion is always read from John on Good Friday. It is in fact shorter than the version given by the other three evangelists, but is filled with profound beauty and meaning. The dialogue between Jesus and Pilate resonates with believer and unbeliever alike, as Pilate looks mournfully at his own power and asks, "Truth? What is that? Jesus entrusts John and Marv to one another, and he gives forth his Spirit at the hour of the evening sacrifice in the Temple. John speaks from the text to say, "This is evidence of one who saw it - trustworthy evidence, and he knows he speaks the truth". A unique element of the Liturgy of the Word on Good Friday is the Great Prayers, the ten universal prayers said in every church throughout the world on this day, each introduced by a deacon and then proclaimed by the celebrant. That these continue to be reserved to the sacred ministers says something about the intercessory role of the priestly ministry, representing the people not only at the altar of the sacrifice but also the altar of the word. The intentions are: for Holy Church; for the Pope; for all orders and degrees of the faithful; for catechumens [those who will be baptised at the Easter Vigil]; for the unity of Christians; for the Jewish People; for those who do not believe in Christ; for those who do not believe in God; for those in public office; for those in tribulation. The prayers range, therefore, across the whole range of belief and unbelief, underlining that God's saving mission is universal, reaching out to all mankind, calling them into relationship with Him at least by justice and good will if they are unable to know Him, the only true God.

The **ROSARY** will be prayed every Tuesday - Friday evening after the 7 pm Mass at Our Lady's Altar for the month of October. As there is no Mass on Monday evenings, the Rosary will be prayed at 7 pm on that day. Everyone welcome.
