THE MASS – THE LITURGY OF THE WORD Cycle of Readings for the Seasons: The Easter Triduum

Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday form a unit in the liturgical year known as the Easter Triduum, three days that stand together – Holy Saturday runs into Easter Sunday as the Easter Vigil is the high point of the liturgical year. The three mysteries of these days – the Last Supper, the Crucifixion and death of Our Lord, and the Resurrection are three parts of the one mystery, marking every other aspect of our faith. The readings for these days do not vary from year to year. Holy Thursday focuses our mind on the Last Supper and its significance.

The first reading, from Exodus, presents the Passover, when the people of Israel ate unleavened bread and a lamb without spot or stain before their liberation from Egypt. This is a foretaste of the Last Supper, where Jesus himself is the Lamb sacrificed to bring us from slavery to sin to freedom in grace, and whose abiding memorial remains with us under the signs of bread and wine now become his body and blood.

The second reading of Holy Thursday is from St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians, recounting the Last Supper. He himself had not been there, of course, but the very fact that he says "This is what I received from the Lord and in turn pass on to you" shows the nature and significance of the Last Supper.

The Gospel of the Holy Thursday is not from Matthew, Mark or Luke, who carefully retell the words and actions of Jesus, but of Saint John, who recounts the washing of feet. This sign that Jesus worked manifests the meaning of the Eucharist, in which Jesus sacrifices himself (taking off his outer garment, that is to say his divinity in a manner of speaking), and washing the feet of the disciples (the washing of sins by the shedding of his blood). It also speaks of what the Eucharist means for life, in which we are called to love one another as Jesus has loved us. By the Eucharist, we encounter and are welcomed into the mystery to unfold between Good Friday and Easter Sunday, namely Christ's death and resurrection, the defeat of sin and death, our salvation.
