

Sunday 15th October 2023 Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Mass – The Liturgy of the Word Cycle of Readings for the Seasons: The Easter Triduum – Holy Saturday

The Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday is made up of four sections: the Liturgy of Light [blessing the Paschal Fire, the blessing and lighting of the Paschal Candle, and the Exultet hymn], the Liturgy of the Word, the Liturgy of Baptism, and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The Liturgy of the Word is the richest in all the celebrations of the Church. There can be seven Old Testament readings, along with their accompanying psalms, along with the New Testament reading or Epistle and the Gospel of the Resurrection. The Old Testament readings follow a deliberate schema that brings us through the "history of salvation", and reflects what Jesus has done for us by the Easter mystery of his death and resurrection. They are as follows: [1] The creation account from Genesis (1:1-2:2), to remind us that God has made a new creation at Easter; the Garden of Gethsemane and the Garden of the Resurrection are a new Eden, where the betrayal of sin is made good by God's fidelity in Christ and the new life that flows from the tree of the cross, forming a new marriage covenant between God and His people. Psalm 103 is a beautiful hymn to God's creating power through His Spirit, who recreates and makes new by grace. [2] The testing of Abraham and his fidelity (Genesis 22:1-18) – the story of the temptation to put the promise before the One who has promised, reflecting the mystery that God the Father did not spare His own Son but gave him up for us all. Jesus is the spotless lamb whom the Father has provided. Psalm 15 recalls trust in God who preserves us from evil. [3] The Exodus account of the Passover and crossing of the Red Sea [Exodus 14:15-15:1]. Jesus is the new Moses who leads his people from slavery to sin through the waters of baptism and into the land of grace. He offers himself as their redemption, the paschal lamb without spot or stain. The canticle of the freed from Exodus is sung (Ex. 15:1-6,16-17: I will sing to the Lord, glorious his triumph!). [4] Isaiah 54:5-14 speaks of the Lord's faithfulness to his unfaithful people in terms of the marriage covenant, reminding us of how Christ describes himself again and again as the Bridegroom. Psalm 29 sings of the Lords pity and fidelity. [5] Isaiah 55:1-11 is the beautiful and poetic reading of God's call to conversion and his promise of the water of life and the food of eternity. The canticle of Isaiah 12:2-6 sings how "with joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation". [6] The Prophet Baruch (3:9-15,32-4:4) speaks of the holy wisdom which is found in Christ and is the gift of his Spirit. Psalm 18 picks this up as it sings of the law of the Lord that "revives the soul". [7] The reading from

the Prophet Ezekiel (36:16-28) again recalls baptism, for God promises he will cleanse His people and restore them in covenant with Him, remove the stone that is in our heart and place His Spirit within us. The beautiful psalm 41 follows – "like the dear that yearns for running streams, so my soul is yearning for you, my God". The Epistle is from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans (6:3-11) where we find the great statement of baptismal faith (when we baptised with Christ we went into the tomb with him.../...so that as Christ was raised from the dead we too might live a new life). It is followed by the announcement of the Easter Alleluia and the Alleluia Psalm (117): "The stone which the builders rejected has become the cornerstone. This is the work of the Lord, a marvel in our eyes". The Gospel of the Resurrection then follows from Matthew, Mark or Luke, according to the year.

Next weekend, we will celebrate **WORLD MISSION SUNDAY**, the Holy Father's annual appeal to support overseas mission and missionaries. Overseas missionaries and the communities they serve are facing extremely difficult challenges. You can help right now by using the special envelope marked 'Mission Sunday' in your box of Sunday envelopes next weekend, or you can donate \in 4.00 by texting the word 'Mission' to 50300.
