

BISHOP MCGUCKIAN recently attended the Synod of Bishops in Rome during the month of October. Its topic was 'synodality' in the life of the Church. Upon his return, he expressed the desire to share his experience with the people of the Diocese. One of the pivotal experiences of the Synod were 'Conversations in the Spirit', a means to help the work of discernment. He intends to share his Synodal experience and further the conversation about how we can continue the work of discernment within the Diocese. We have many contexts in which we need to develop and use the gift of discernment. THE MASS – THE LITURGY OF THE WORD CYCLE OF READINGS FOR THE SEASONS: THE EASTER SEASON

The Easter Season begins with the Easter Octave, sometimes referred to as the Great Sunday, which runs to the Sunday following Easter Sunday which has been known by various names over the centuries: Low Sunday, Dominica in Albis [White Sunday] and, more recently, Divine Mercy Sunday. Octaves are the week following the principal celebrations in the Church's liturgical year, of which the octaves of Christmas and Easter are the only ones retained in the liturgical calendar [there was one an octave following the feast of Pentecost]. The Easter Octave is really a prolongation of the feast of Easter, in both its rich Mass formularies and the readings chosen for these days. The first reading throughout this week, and stretching into much of the Easter Season, is taken from the Acts of the Apostles. The Acts recount the first days and years of the Church after the resurrection and ascension of Our Lord. Reading them, we encounter the freshness of the Gospel when first proclaimed, and the transformation in courage and faith it effected in the apostles. In the days after Easter, we hear them witnessing to the experience of the resurrection, their encounters with the Risen Lord, and its meaning which transforms faith.

We realise that faith in the resurrection is the touchstone for faith in Jesus, who died to forgive our sins and reconcile us to the Father. The Gospel accounts of this week present the various encounters with the Risen Lord by Mary Magdalene and the Apostles.
