

Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Mass – The Liturgy of the Word Cycle of Readings for the Seasons: The Easter Triduum – Easter Sunday

Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord is the great day of rejoicing. The readings reflect this, and also have a quietness about them after the abundance of the Vigil. The first reading, from the Acts of the Apostles [10:34,37-43], presents Peter preaching to Cornelius and his household about the events of Jesus' death and resurrection. The passage is like a short creed in which Peter fulfils his most important witness, in union with the other apostles: he is a witness to Jesus' baptism in the Jordan at which he was anointed with the Spirit; he is a witness that he "went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil"; he is a witness that "they killed him by hanging him on a tree"; he is a witness that "three days afterwards God raised him to life"; and he is a witness that "we are those witnesses" to whom the Lord showed himself. He asserts: "we ate and drank with him after his resurrection from the dead" and "he has ordered us to proclaim this to everyone" since "all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name".

The Psalm [117] takes up the refrain that is the song of this day: "This is the day that was made by the Lord, let us be glad and rejoice in it", since "the stone rejected by the builders has become the keystone" and it is "a marvel in our eyes".

The second reading, from St. Paul to the Colossians [3:1-4], teaches us, "Since you have been brought back to life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is sitting at God's right hand". Before the Gospel, the Paschal Sequence, Victimae Paschali, is sung or read. It is an ancient hymn recounting Mary Magdalene's joy in her encounter with the Lord: "Christ is truly risen from the dead we know. Victorious King thy mercy show!"

The Gospel is read from St. John [20:1-9] recounts the events of Easter morning, where Mary of Magdala, Peter and John are the protagonists. Mary comes upon the empty tomb and runs to fetch Peter. John runs with him, but reaches the tomb first, being much younger. He is full of respect of Peter, who must be the first and the authoritative witness, and so he waits for Peter and allows him to enter in. John describes his own reaction: he saw and he believed". It is the call of each disciple on Easter morning: to see and to believe in the simple and marvellous fact of the resurrection.
