First Sunday of Lent

The Mass – The Liturgy of the Word Cycle of Readings for the Seasons: The Easter Season – Pentecost

To conclude this part of our series on the Mass, where for some time we have been looking at the Liturgy of the Word, in the Easter Season, which concludes with Pentecost. At the Mass on Pentecost Sunday itself, the first reading is from the Acts of the Apostles, recounting the experience of the apostles in the Upper Room and the descent upon them of the Holy Spirit [Acts 2:1-11]. It is followed by Psalm 103, with its beautiful observation: "You take back your spirit, they die, returning to the dust from which they came. You send forth your spirit, they are created, and you renew the face of the earth". The Spirit hovered over the waters at the creation, and brought everything into being out of nothing. He descended upon the waters of Jesus' baptism and anointed him. He descends through the waters of baptism to make our souls a new creation, and indeed the Lord "makes all things new" [Revelations 21:5]. The garden of the Resurrection is the place of the new creation, Jesus the New Adam, the Church the New Eve. The Redemption by Jesus' saving action on the cross puts an end to sin and a new beginning to life. All this is the work of the Spirit.

Reflecting the manifold graces of the Spirit represented by the gift of tongues received by the Apostles, the Second Reading is taken from St. Paul's Letter to the Corinthians [12:3-7,12-13], where he presents the Church as a body of which we are its many parts, distinguished by differed gifts of the Spirit. In addition, we are told that "No one can say 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit" [v.3]. There follows the Sequence, the great hymn to the Holy Spirit, Veni Sante Spiritus: "Thou in toil art comfort sweet; pleasant coolness in the heat; solace in the midst of woe". The Gospel reading is from Saint John and describes Jesus as giving the gift of the Spirit on the very evening of the Day of Resurrection [John 20:19-23]. The giving of the Holy Spirit is directed for the forgiveness of sins, the crux of the great commission to "go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And know that I am with you to the end of the ages" [Matthew 28:19-20]. He remains in His Spirit, and by the power of the Spirit in many other ways.

There will be a **MASS OF THANKSGIVING** with Bishop Alan McGuckian on Monday 26th February at 7 pm in St. Eunan's Cathedral, to mark his departure from the Diocese as he prepares to take up his duties as Bishop of Down and Connor.
